ART

INDIVIDUALISED PROJECT ART (8VART)

EXTRA-CURRICULA CHARGE	\$20.00
DESCRIPTION	Individual Project Art will allow students to engage with individual explorations and undertake a major project. Each student will be given a framework to underpin a personal investigation and art project. They will develop their skills by engaging in the art process, analysing and evaluating influences and the artworks of others from different times and places. Students will also work on applying skills to create their own artworks. They will devise a work plan and establish a process of inquiry via a statement of intention. Students will then research, explore, develop, refine, reflect and evaluate throughout their project. At the end of each semester the class will have a mini exhibition of the work completed by all students. If you love Art and want the opportunity to pursue and develop your own ideas into art works, this is the subject for you.

COMMUNITY ARTS (8COMART)

EXTRA-CURRICULA CHARGE	\$20.00
DESCRIPTION	<p>In Community Arts students will work collaboratively on researching, designing, developing and creating artworks to connect to the broader school community. Projects in this subject may be different and unique each semester. Links with other subject domains, school community developments and projects, external community groups and professional artists will all be explored.</p> <p>The focus will be on making art for community and connection with others. A wide range of art materials and techniques may be explored including, but not limited to, mural and display painting, mosaic making, public sculpture and installation creation and more contemporary methods of digital art making.</p>

DESIGN TECHNOLOGY

MAKE IT WITH TIMBER (8WOOD)

EXTRA-CURRICULA CHARGE	\$30.00
DESCRIPTION	The focus of this elective is traditional woodwork skills and learning to work with the characteristics of timber. Limited time will be spent on the design process. Students will produce a laminated serving platter and a wall mounted coat rack. The laser cutter, vinyl and paint can be used to add decoration to the products.

RETRO METAL (8METAL)

EXTRA-CURRICULA CHARGE \$30.00

DESCRIPTION The focus of this elective is traditional metalwork skills and learning to work with the characteristics of non-ferrous metals. Limited time will be spent on the design process. Students will produce an enamelled copper bowl and a silver soldered ring. The ring project can be extended by adding resin, stamping texture or working with its shape.

COURSE ASSESSMENT Safe use of tools and machinery, correct and efficient use of equipment, understanding of material characteristics, successful completion of projects.

ROBOT CHALLENGE (8ROBOT)

EXTRA-CURRICULA CHARGE \$30.00

DESCRIPTION Students will have two coding challenges in this elective through the design, building and programming of a robot using LEGO EV3 Mindstorms. The challenges are to create the robot that completes the set task the fastest or most efficiently. Students will develop skills related to forces, motion, electricity, construction and coding. Students will also have coding and flying challenges with the Mambo Drone fleet. Mambo Mini Drones are used to navigate a series of obstacles and courses.

STEM/CO2 RACE CARS (8STEM)

EXTRA-CURRICULA CHARGE \$30.00

DESCRIPTION Students will be competing in teams of 2-4 to design and race a 3D printed car. The top 2 fastest teams will be registered to compete in the PrintACar challenge (organised by Quantum Victoria), which is a state-wide event that engages teams of 2-4 secondary students in the design and racing of 3D printed cars. During the semester, students will learn how to use the CAD program Onshape to draw their designs, then produce them using a 3D printer. They will evaluate the speed of the cars to help inform possible improvements made to future designs.

SEW COOL (8SEW)

EXTRA-CURRICULA CHARGE \$30.00

DESCRIPTION The focus of this elective is basic pattern making, sewing machine skills and learning various ways of decorating fabric. These include printmaking, embroidery and applique techniques. These skills will be taught in a contemporary context. Students will produce fabric tote bag that they will decorate.

Improve your writing and creative talents in this unit. Perhaps this could be your first step towards creating a literary masterpiece!

FOOD WITH FLAIR (8FLAIR)

EXTRA-CURRICULA CHARGE	\$70.00
DESCRIPTION	You will learn techniques in food presentation which naturally leads to making food products that can be used to celebrate events or to give as gifts. Techniques explored will include baking (eg. cookies, decorated/iced cakes), pastries and preserves. Labelling and packaging of food products will be explored.

PIRATES, PLAGUES AND PRISONERS (8PPE)

DESCRIPTION	Choose your own adventure through Historical Inquiry. In this subject you will oversee the topic you learn about, from the questioning point right up to the historical argument. Topics you can choose from include The Vikings, The Ottoman Empire, The Angkor/Khmer Empire, Polynesian Expansion across the Pacific, The Black Death and Renaissance Italy. Enjoy studying the History you're interested in and leading your own Inquiry in this student led subject. Your findings will be presented in your final project which will take the format of a variety of options including a film or documentary, a diorama, a graphic novel or creative story, an audio-visual presentation.

It is a select entry program that offers the current EXCEL Sport students the opportunity to further enhance their individual sporting aspirations.
