MAKE IT WITH TIMBER (8WOOD)

DESCRIPTION

The focus of this elective is traditional woodwork skills and learning to work with the characteristics of timber. Limited time will be spent on the design process. Students will produce a laminated serving platter and a wall mounted coat rack. The laser cutter, vinyl and paint can be used to add decoration to the products.

RETRO METAL (8METAL)

EXTRA-CURRICULA CONTRIBUTION

DESCRIPTION

The focus of this elective is traditional metalwork skills and learning to work with the characteristics of non-ferrous metals. Limited time will be spent on the design process. Students will produce an enamelled copper bowl and a silver soldered ring. The ring project can be extended by adding resin, stamping

texture or working with its shape.

ROBOT CHALLENGE (8ROBOT)

CURRICULUM CONTRIBUTION \$33.00

DESCRIPTION Students will have two coding challenges in this elective through the design,

building and programming of a robot using LEGO EV3 Mindstorms. The challenges are to create the robot that completes the set task the fastest or most efficiently. Students will develop skills related to forces, motion, electricity, construction and coding. Students will also have coding and

flying challenges with the Mambo Drone fleet. Mambo Mini Drones are used to navigate a series of obstacles and courses.

STEM RACE CARS (8STEM)

EXTRA-CURRICULA CONTRIBUTION

\$33.00

DESCRIPTION Students will work in teams of 2-4 to design and make race cars using a range

of materials from the STEM area. The students will shape a timber car body, create laser cut wheels and 3D print accessories such as spoilers. They will develop skills in using the CAD programs CorelDRAW and Onshape to draw their designs. The speed of the cars will be measured to help inform improvements to their car designs. The students will race their final car designs to compete for the Fastest Individual Car Award and the Fastest

Team Award.

SEW COOL (8SEW)

EXTRA-CURRICULA CONTRIBUTION

DESCRIPTION The focus of this elective is to explore the art of textiles through the

production of a soft toy and a woven basket. Both projects will look at traditional methods and apply them in more contemporary ways. Each student will make two products that will demonstrate their individual design ideas. The soft toy will involve embroidery, applique and hand stitching. Students will look at the work of the Tjanpi Desert Weavers and the techniques they use as inspiration for their basket weaving. Extension work will be a small project to learn about and practice sewing on a sewing

machine.

BOOKMAKING & ILLUSTRATION (8BOOK)

DESCRIPTION Are you a budding author or artist – or maybe both? This elective offers

you a great opportunity to create an original literary work, complete with your own illustrations. Develop and refine your writing and

creative talents in this unit and be exposed to existing works that might surprise and inspire you. Perhaps this could be your first step towards producing a literary masterpiece that is enjoyed and remembered

through the ages!

FOOD WITH FLAIR (8FLAIR)

HUMANITIES

PIRATES, PLAGUES AND PRISONERS (8PPE)

DESCRIPTION Choose your own adventure through Historical Inquiry. In this subject you

will oversee the topic you learn about, from the questioning point right up to the historical argument. Topics you can choose from include The Vikings, The Ottoman Empire, The Angkor/Khmer Empire, Polynesian Expansion across the Pacific, The Black Death and Renaissance Italy. Enjoy studying the History you're interested in and leading your own Inquiry in this student led subject. Your findings will be presented in your final project which will take the format of a variety of options including a film or documentary, a diorama, a graphic novel or creative story, an audio-visual presentation.

LANGUAGES

GERMAN LANGUAGE AND CULTURE (8GLC)

DESCRIPTION In the German language and culture elective, students have the opportunity

to extend their knowledge and understanding of both the German language and culture in a different teaching environment. This elective runs alongside

normal classroom lessons but provides more depth and additional

background on topics covered as well as bonus material not covered in the main classes. German elective students also have the opportunity to attend annual activities like the German Film Festival and take part in several German competitions – such as creating German advertisements or vlogs.

PERFORMING ARTS

YEAR 8 BAND (8BAND)

PRE-REQUISITES Participation in the instrumental music program.

Year 8 instrumental music students must pick this elective for both Semesters 1 and 2 as it will run for both Semesters 1 and 2.

DESCRIPTION The Year 8 Band elective will provide the opportunity to learn new and

exciting songs and rehearse once a week as a band. Students will improve their ability to read music and play songs of increasing difficulty. There will also be opportunities to perform at school and in the wider community as well as excursion opportunities to see the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra

and an incursion with the Navy band.

DANCE WORKS (8DAN)

DESCRIPTION In Year 8 Dance, students are exposed to a range of dance techniques and

styles. They are introduced to the choreographic process used to create dances and work in small groups to produce their own dance works. They also learn a dance work and further develop their understanding of group formations. Students engage in rehearsal, pre-performance and

performance practices.

SHOWTIME (8SHOW)

DESCRIPTION

In Showtime, students step into the world of musical theatre, exploring acting, singing and dancing while learning how to bring a full-scale production to life. Working collaboratively as an ensemble, students workshop a musical from planning stages to the final performance.

Throughout the unit, students take on both performance and the production roles, gaining experience in direction, choreography, costume, set design, make-up, hair, props, lighting, sound and publicity. They develop skills in rehearsal processes, creative problem solving and teamwork, while building confidence in performance.

The unit culminates in the presentation of their finished production at the Drama Showcase, performed for parents and Year 7 students. No prior experience is required - just enthusiasm, commitment and a passion for the Performing Arts.

THEATRESPORTS (8THS)

DESCRIPTION

In Theatresports, students dive into the exciting world of improvisation, building confidence, creativity and quick-thinking skills. Through drama games and structured activities, they learn the core principles of improvisation, including teamwork, spontaneity, listening and storytelling.

As part of their assessment, students design and present their own original drama games, developing both performance and leadership skills. They then put their learning into action by participating in a live Theatresports presentation at the Drama Showcase, where they perform improvisation challenges in front of an audience of parents and Year 7 students.

No prior experience is needed - just a willingness to take risks, have fun and say "yes" to new ideas.

DESCRIPTION This course is a continuation of the EXCEL Sport program offered at Year 7.

It is a select entry program that offers the current EXCEL Sport students the opportunity to further enhance their individual sporting aspirations. The students will continue to develop the specialised movement skills to participate in a range of team-based sports confidently and competently. The program also continues to explore the strategic principles of team organisation, while enhancing game sense knowledge in a variety of settings. individual training programs, fitness testing, talent identification, sports coaching, video analysis techniques and technology in sport. This program will extend students' abilities in a range of sports and individual pursuits.
