Re 2026 – Year 10 Parent Payments

Patterson River Secondary College is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of our voluntary financial contributions for 2026.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum, and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary, with Extra-Curricular Items and Activities provided on a user-pays basis.

Patterson River receives very strong voluntary contributions from families which enables the College to provide students with a diverse range of experiences, facilities, and resources. In 2021, we introduced the option for families to make voluntary contributions towards targeted areas that they could select from. This has resulted in a significant increase in contributions over and above normal subject fees which this year enabled us to purchase a range of new equipment and resources, including:

- German Levelled Reader Books
- Food Kitchen Garden Wicking Beds
- Maths Ti Inspire CX Navigator 30 System
- Music Percussion Equipment for Classroom Music
- BTF Shade Sails for Student Areas
- Science Electricity Kits
- Families in Need Stationary Starter Packs and Calculators
- Significant contributions to other areas that will roll over into 2026 targeted areas (see below)

We invite parents to consider making contributions towards our new initiatives, some of which are in tax-deductible areas.

There are three financial contribution categories to ensure the successful operation and resourcing of our Educational Programs:

Curriculum Contributions – These are voluntary contributions which parents/carers pay to the school to provide essential support to the standard curriculum program. This payment ensures that the College can offer high quality programs and facilities for all students.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities – These items and activities are provided in addition to the standard curriculum program and are designed to broaden the school experience for your child. This includes activities such as camps, along with certain subjects that your child may have chosen that are in addition to the standard curriculum at that year level. For example, all students complete Technology in Year 8 however, your child may have also selected an additional subject such as Retro Metal, which has an associated user-pays contribution.

Other Contributions – These are voluntary contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives. Patterson River Secondary College continues to welcome your contributions to support our school. Your child will not be disadvantaged if you do not make a voluntary contribution. All records of voluntary contributions are kept confidential, as well as your decision about whether to contribute or not.

Payment Methods

- 2 Monthly Compass instalments on **31 January, 28 February, 31 March, 30 April, 31 May**
- 3 Individualised Compass instalment dates tailored to suit
- 4 Personalised payment plans for Extra-Curricular Items and Activities via Direct Debit
- 5 Centrepay deductions (option for CSEF recipients)

Financial Support for Families

Patterson River Secondary College understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
